<p>Day 1 November 4 Thursday</p>	<p>USA-Ireland. Depart USA for overnight flight to Ireland. Dinner and in-flight entertainment is served shortly after take-off.</p>
<p>Day 2 November 5 Friday</p>	<p>Dublin. Morning arrival at Dublin Airport where you are greeted by your Driver/Guide. Leaving the airport we travel to a nearby venue where everyone will have an opportunity for their first Full Irish Breakfast (on own expense). We travel into Dublin Town where we enjoy a panoramic tour of this 1000-year old city. We then see statue filled <i>O'Connell Street, The General Post Office scene of the 1916 Easter Uprising, as well as Georgian Square.</i> Our group will then enjoy a visit to the Guinness Brewery. Group will be dropped off on Nassau Street for some free browsing time. We will then check into our hotel. Overnight Dublin at Camden Court Hotel. Dinner is on your own.</p>
<p>Day 3 November 6 Saturday</p>	<p>Dublin-Blarney-Killarney. Morning departure from Dublin has us heading south through Naas home to The Irish National Stud Farm, famous for breeding 90% of the world's thoroughbred horses. Our journey passes by the Rock of Cashel for a visual view of this impressive site where legend has it St. Patrick crowned the High Kings of Ireland in the 5th century. We continue to Blarney famous for its 14th century kissing stone and plentiful woolen mills. Our journey takes us east over the Kerry and Cork Mountains to Macroom where we pause for a short visit. This is the main market town for the Gaelic speaking region to the west. Macroom Castle dates from the 13th century and was the seat of the McCarthys of Muskerry. Oliver Cromwell granted it to Admiral Sir William Penn whose namesake son spent much of his childhood here and later founded the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. We then arrive in Killarney for overnight at The Killarney Avenue Hotel. Dinner this evening at our hotel!</p>
<p>Day 4 November 7 Sunday</p>	<p>Dingle. After breakfast we depart Killarney for the Dingle Peninsula. The journey begins with some of the most magnificent scenery in all of Ireland. The little town of Dingle is straight out of a story book. The fishing boats in the harbor and tiny brightly painted pubs portray a time that has continued to stand still. The population of 1500 people and only 52 pubs are ready to welcome you this afternoon. Worth the wait is the native seafood chowder served up at lunch time with freshly baked brown bread. We continue on to Sleah Head. Along the way, we will see bee hive style huts, originally inhabited by 12th century monks, which overlook the rugged Blasket Islands. The awe inspiring beauty of this particular area is unmatched. There is no other landscape in western Europe with the density and variety of archaeological monuments as found on the Dingle Peninsula. This evening, you will enjoy dinner at a traditional Killarney restaurant suggested by your Guide, after which we suggest you may partake of lively Irish music in one of the many Killarney Pubs. Overnight Killarney at The Killarney Avenue Hotel. Dinner is on your own.</p>
<p>Day 5 November 8 Monday</p>	<p>Killarney-Adare-Limerick-Galway. After a full Irish Breakfast we depart Killarney and travel north first stopping at Adare, once voted "The Prettiest Village" with its thatched roof cottages. We continue through Limerick, Ireland's 3rd largest city and home to author Frank McCourt who wrote Angela's Ashes. It is on through County Clare to The Majestic Cliffs of Moher. The Cliffs rise 700 feet and stretch out along the Atlantic Coastline for five miles We continue through the rugged Burren landscape, a limestone region dotted with caves and rivers and many ancient megalithic tombs. Our group arrives into Galway city. We take some time here to enjoy this youthful bustling town with a walk from Eyre Square down traditional "Shop Street". Overnight Galway at The Imperial Hotel. Dinner is on your own.</p>
<p>Day 6 November 9 Tuesday</p>	<p>Aran Islands. After a full Irish Breakfast we enjoy an Optional Tour of The Aran Islands. Inis Mór is the largest of the three Aran Islands and is the most developed in terms of tourist facilities. There are about 900 inhabitants on Inis Mór making it by far the most populated of the islands. The main village on the island is Kilronan, which has a quite large harbour that accommodates a vast amount of tourist travel to the island. There are minibuses as well as horse and carts to take people around. Those not taking the tour have a free day to explore Galway city. We return to Galway where we have plenty of time</p>

	for browsing or shopping before enjoying a farewell dinner and overnight at our hotel. (For those not travelling to Aran Islands you may enjoy the day at leisure in Galway) Overnight Galway at The Imperial Hotel. Dinner at our hotel.
Day 7 November 10 Wednesday	Galway-Shannon. Morning departure by Private Transfer for nearby Shannon Airport. Arrive with plenty of time for last minute duty-free shopping before boarding your flight home. Arrive home the same day. In the true Irish Tradition we wish you a "Safe Home".
