Day 1	USA-Dublin			
April 10				
Tuesday				
Day 2	Dublin Airport- Galway . Morning arrival at Dublin Airport where after clearing customs you are met by your			
April 11	Professional Irish Driver/Guides. We begin our journey by traveling west to Athlone in the center of Ireland. In 1120 the			
Wednesday	Connaught king built the first of six successive wicker or wooden bridges and in 1129 a castle to defend it. Bridge and			
	castle were destroyed on behalf of the Meath kingdom and rebuilt by the Connaught kings' successively over the next			
	forty years. In 1168 the Annals of the Four Masters record a residence in Athlone for the King of Connaught. The Cluniac			
	priory was founded on the west bank in 1150. We will then arrive in Galway and check into our hotel. The rest of the			
	day you are free to enjoy Galway. Overnight Imperial Hotel Galway.			
Day 3	Galway. Free day in Galway or you may want to take an optional trip to the Aran Islands. This day-trip takes the			
April 12	whole day, so do not go for it unless you are up to it. On the Island, the way of life is as it would have been in days gone			
Thursday	by, except for the mini-vans that take tourists on sightseeing trip, it has remained as it was in the 19 th century. The most			
	impressive of all the ancient fortresses in Ireland, is here, Dun Aengus Fortress. Built to maximize defense, it is			
	surrounded by high walls on three sides, the other is a sheer drop of 500 feet to the ocean. Overnight Imperial Hotel

Day 4	Galway- Cliffs of Moher- Killarney. Today after breakfast we may take a tour of Ireland's stony place - the Burren			
April 13	(Bhoireann). It is home to rare alpine plants, delicate wonders that grow in the thin soil and crevices - gentians, orchids			
Friday	and maidenhair ferns amongst others. The survival of both alpine and Mediterranean plants in this unusual habitat			
	continues to arouse and to delight its visitors. The Burren contains dozens of megalithic tombs, Celtic crosses and a			
	ruined Cistercian Abbey dating from the 12th century, Corcomroe. You can find villages abandoned since famine times			
	and green roads on which you can walk for miles without ever seeing a car. Continue on and gaze at the majestic awe of			
	the breathtaking Cliffs of Moher . The cliffs, a spectacular natural phenomenon, rise 660 feet above the Atlantic.			
	O'Brien's Tower is the best location from which to view the Cliffs. From this vantage point one can see the Aran Islands as well as The Twelve Pins and the Maum Turk Mountains to the north in Connemara. As you leave the cliffs you'll			
	travel through the little village of Liscannor and just across the bay, you'll see the beautiful seaside village and golfers'			
	mecca, Lahinch. We then arrive in Killarney. Dinner & Overnight Killarney Plaza Hotel.			
Day 5	Killarney- Dingle- Killarney. After breakfast we depart Killarney for the Dingle Peninsula. The journey begins with			
April 14	some of the most magnificent scenery in all of Ireland. The little town of Dingle is straight out of a story book. The			
Saturday	fishing boats in the harbor and tiny brightly painted pubs portray a time that has continued to stand still. The population			
- Jaraz aay	of 1500 people and only 52 pubs are ready to welcome you this afternoon. Worth the wait is the native seafood chowder			
	served up at lunch time with freshly baked brown bread. We continue on to Slea Head. Along the way, we will see bee			
	hive style huts, originally inhabited by 12 th century monks, which overlook the rugged Blasket Islands. The awe inspiring			
	beauty of this particular area is unmatched. There is no other landscape in western Europe with the density and variety of			
	archaeological monuments as found on the Dingle Peninsula. Overnight Killarney Plaza Hotel.			
Day 6	Killarney- Blarney- Cork. Breakfast is followed by a leisurely departure from Killarney where many new friends have			
April 15	been made. Our next stop, the picturesque town of Blarney, is the home of Blarney Castle and the Blarney stone			
Sunday	(admission additional for those who wish to climb to the top), which legend has it bequeaths the "gift of eloquence" to

	all who kiss it. Time to shop at the historical woolen mills or stop in Christy's Pub for a Pint! We depart Blarney and			
	travel to Cork City. Driving into Cork City, we are treated to a panoramic tour before reaching our final destination, the			
	River Lee Hotel Cork. Overnight Imperial Hotel Cork.			
Day 7	Cork- Midleton- Kinsale- Cork. After breakfast we travel to Midleton and the Midleton Distillery. We will enjoy a			
April 16	tour here. Visitors can see the largest Pot Still in the work with a capacity of 32,000 gallons and the Old Waterwheel			
Monday	manufactured in 1825 to provide motive power prior to the days of electricity, and still turning today. It is onto Kinsale.			
	Kinsale in County Cork is one of the most picturesque, popular and fashionable resorts of the south-west coast of Ireland.			
	Famous for its beautiful yachting, sea angling, gourmet restaurants and golf. Charles Fort, a popular attraction was			
	constructed in the late 17th century on the site of an earlier coastal fortification. Charles Fort is a classic example of a			
	star-shaped fort and has five bastions. The two seaward bastions, the Devil's and the Charles' were for defending the			
	harbor and both are casemated - that is, they have gun embrasures inside as well as on top of the walls. Desmond Castle,			
	(French Prison) Cork Street, Kinsale, built as a custom house by the Earl of Desmond c. AD 1500. Desmond Castle has			
	had a colorful history, ranging from Spanish occupation in 1601 to use as a prison for captured American sailors during			
	the American War of Independence. Known locally as 'The French Prison' after a tragic fire in which 54 prisoners,			
	mainly French seamen, died in 1747. The castle was also used as a borough jail from 1791 to the onset of the Great			
	Famine when it was used as an auxiliary workhouse tending to the starving populace. Time to explore this area. We			
	return to Cork. Overnight Imperial Hotel Cork.			
Day 8	Cork- Dublin. Early departure from Cork. Travel north to Dublin. Upon arrival we enjoy a panoramic tour of this 1000			
April 17	year old city. You will be sure to see St. Patrick's Cathedral where writer Jonathan Swift gave his sermons, The G.P.O.			
Tuesday	on O'Connell Street scene of the 1916 Easter Uprising where the bullet holes still remain to this day. Drive through			
	famous Phoenix Park where the Pope said Mass in late 70's and finally Trinity College which houses the 8 th century			
	manuscripts, The Book of Kells, still preserved as they were when the Monks produced them all those centuries ago.			
	Overnight Camden Court Dublin.			
Day 9	Dublin- Dublin Airport. Today we are privately transferred to Dublin Airport for our flight home.
