

CLASSICALLY IRELAND TOUR 2027

DAY 1 DUBLIN

Arrive at Dublin Airport from your overnight flight. After clearing customs, make your way via taxi (additional cost; the taxi stand is directly outside) to your hotel, the Radisson Blu Royal Hotel. You will have the rest of the afternoon free to explore Dublin with your Hop On Hop Off Bus Pass. Stops may include (but are not limited to) St. Patrick's Cathedral, the G.P.O., Trinity College (Book of Kells), the Guinness Storehouse, Jameson Distillery, St. Stephen's Green and many more. **Overnight Radisson Blu Royal Hotel, Dublin.**

DAY 2 DUBLIN – CORK

We enjoy a traditional Irish breakfast this morning. After breakfast we meet our Driver Guide in the lobby of the hotel and travel south, stopping at the Rock of Cashel, the dramatic ancient seat of the kings of Munster. We then continue to Cobh, a charming waterfront town from which many people departed Ireland during the Great Famine. At the Cobh Heritage Centre, learn about the story of Irish emigration, hear about the ill-fated Titanic (Cobh was its final port of call) and the Lusitania, and immerse yourself in Irish history. **Dinner and overnight Imperial Hotel, Cork.**

DAY 3 CORK – KILLARNEY

We enjoy a traditional Irish breakfast this morning. We start our journey with a visit to Blarney Castle, home of the Blarney Stone. Visitors come here, of course, to kiss the stone, which is said to give the gift of the gab. We then make our way to Killarney. **Overnight Killarney International Hotel.**

DAY 4 KILLARNEY – DINGLE – KILLARNEY

After breakfast we depart Killarney for the Dingle Peninsula. The journey begins with some of the most magnificent scenery in all of Ireland. We continue to Sleah Head. Along the way, we will see beehive-style huts, originally inhabited by 12th-century monks, which overlook the rugged Blasket Islands. There is no other landscape in western Europe with the density and variety of archaeological monuments found on the Dingle Peninsula. Back in Killarney, we enjoy a Jaunting Car ride through Killarney National Park. **Dinner and overnight Killarney International Hotel.**

DAY 5 KILLARNEY – GALWAY

Today after breakfast we head north to the Cliffs of Moher, which are stupefyingly impressive and staggeringly beautiful. On a clear day you'll channel Barbra Streisand, because you can see forever: the Aran Islands stand etched on the waters of Galway Bay, and beyond lie the hills of Connemara. On the way to the Cliffs, we travel through the little village of Liscannor and pass the beautiful seaside village and golfers' mecca of Lahinch, just across the bay. As you leave the Cliffs, we may take a tour of Ireland's stony place, the Burren, on our way to Galway. **Dinner and overnight Radisson Red Hotel, Galway.**

DAY 6

CONNEMARA TOUR

After breakfast we depart and tour the vast Connemara region. Connemara (Conmaicne Mara – the tribe of Cormac by the sea) has white sandy beaches, dark bogs and tall jagged mountains that make it one of the most scenic and unspoiled areas in the country. Wild and rugged, in some places Gaelic remains the only spoken language. We travel first to Clifden (An Clochán). Founded in the early 19th century by John D'Arcy, it retains much of its Georgian architecture. Placed at the head of a broad Atlantic bay and nestled below the Twelve Bens, the town is blessed by its beautiful setting. Known as the capital of Connemara, Clifden is a lively location full of shops, pubs, restaurants and cafés. From here, travel the Sky Road, an exhilarating circular drive west of Clifden. Return to Galway. **Overnight Radisson Red Hotel, Galway.**

DAY 7

GALWAY – DUBLIN

After a hearty Irish breakfast, we leave Galway and make our way to Dublin, stopping along the way at Clonmacnoise. With a nearby ruined castle for company, the setting is quite sublime at Clonmacnoise, one of Ireland's holiest and most significant monastic sites. We continue to Dublin, where many of the city's most important sights and museums are found, as is Dublin's best-loved city park, St. Stephen's Green. **Overnight Radisson Blu Royal Hotel, Dublin.**

DAY 8

DUBLIN AIRPORT

Make your way via taxi to Dublin Airport for your flight home.
